

## Materials recovery in public places Citizens want the opportunity to recycle more

**Montréal, February 18, 2016** – Quebecers want to do their part for the environment by recycling more, whether that is at home or elsewhere. Those are the findings of a recent CROP survey conducted on behalf of Éco Entreprises Québec (ÉEQ).

Released just this morning, the numbers produced by the first survey on the subject show that, when materials recovery equipment is available in public places, 83% of Quebecers always use them, while 15% use them only occasionally. They mainly place water bottles (71%), newspapers and other printed matter (62%), milk or juice containers (47%), coffee cups (39%) and other containers and packaging in recycling bins in order to give these materials a second life via the curbside recycling system.

What's more, almost three-quarters of respondents (74%) would like to have more access to materials recovery equipment in public places, particularly in parks and along commercial streets.

"These data came in at the perfect time, as 2016 marks the last year of the Away-from-Home Recovery Program managed by ÉEQ. The program provides financial assistance for the purchase of recovery equipment to be installed in municipal public places throughout Quebec," says Maryse Vermette, ÉEQ's President and CEO. "Municipalities wish to make their contribution to preserving the environment, but since this equipment can be expensive, we understand that a little help is necessary. That is why we got involved in the implementation of this unique program in North America. The objective is to have a recycling bin next to every public place trash can so that recyclable materials may be recovered just like at home. Quebecers are already materials recovery champions and, with the financial contribution of companies who put containers, packaging and printed matter on the market, we wish to cooperate with Quebec municipalities to meet their expectations and help their citizens continue their good recycling habits wherever they are."

In addition to financially compensating residential curbside recycling, companies who put containers, packaging and printed matter on Quebec's market also compensate the costs of materials recovery outside the home, specifically collection costs from away-from-home equipment in accordance with the Environment Quality Act.

## About the Away-from-Home Recovery Program

The Away-from-Home Recovery Program reimburses 70% of the cost of away-from-home recovery equipment up to a maximum of \$840 per unit. To date, over 11,000 bins were installed throughout Quebec, for a total investment of over \$5.5 million. Municipal organizations have until December 31, 2016, to submit their request to ÉEQ's team, even if they've benefited from the program in the past.
