Broadening materials subject to a fee

Objective: equity and coherence

Containers, packaging and printed matter sold as products (CP&PM products) were included in the calculation of the expected quantities to establish the 2018 Schedule of Contributions in order to broaden materials subject to a fee in order to include more materials covered by the net costs paid to municipalities. Therefore, as of the 2018 Schedule of Contributions, short-life containers and packaging sold as products and printed matter sold as products must be reported.

CP&PM products may be grouped into different classes. The classes are not limited: they are only provided to facilitate the identification of the CP&PM products included in the broadening.

Excluded Short-life containers and packaging sold as products

Containers and packaging explicitly and solely intended to contain or package garbage and all other types of waste designated under another regulation:

- Trash bags
- Compost bags
- Vacuum bags
- Biomedical waste bags

Excluded Printed matter sold as products

- Books
- Materials included in the newspaper category
- Schoolbooks
- Personal medical files
- Identification documents (birth certificate, passport, etc.)
- Printed matter intended to be used or consumed only by a final user at the sales or distribution site (e.g. paper placemats and menus in a restaurant)
