

Future sorting centre in the east end of the Island of Montreal: raising the bar for the recycling industry

The new, state-of-the-art facility will be designed to ensure optimal sorting performance, with operating conditions that set a new industry standard:

- Located in an industrial district in the on-island suburb of Montréal-Est;
- Building size: 120,000 square feet;
- Sorting capacity: 150,000 tonnes per year;
- Indoor receiving area for incoming materials;
- Fully indoor baling area;
- Sorting operations in a heated building with zoned air-conditioning for workers;
- 7 indoor loading docks;
- Leading-edge processing equipment made entirely in Quebec;
- 94 jobs to be created;
- Canada's most technologically sophisticated sorting centre, and the second-most advanced in North America;
- Full sprinkler coverage for the whole building;
- Observation platform for training purposes.
